"Pursue a Paul"

Paul was a man of relationships. Throughout the book of Acts Paul is regularly accompanied by other individuals on his missionary journeys.

In Acts 13, he sets out on the first missionary journey with Barnabas and John Mark by his side. When time came for the second missionary journey, he took Silas with him (Acts 15:40) and recruited Timothy (Acts 16:1-3). Eventually Luke would join him (as evidenced by the use of the pronoun "we" in Acts 16:10-16; 2 Timothy 4:11) as would Priscilla and Aquila (Acts 18:1-3, 18), Erastus (Acts 19:22), Sopater, Aristarchus, Secundus, Gaius, Tychicus, and Trophimus (Acts 20:4). In his epistles, we learn that Paul also worked with Titus (Galatians 2:1-3), Onesimus (Philemon 1:10), Onesiphorus (2 Timothy 1:16), Epaphroditus (Philippians 2:25-30), Epaphras (Colossians 1:7-8), and Demas (Philemon 24) who eventually deserted him (2 Timothy 4:10).

Paul's intimate relationships allowed him to serve as a mentor to many, especially Timothy and Titus both of whom he identified as a spiritual son (1 Timothy 1:2; Titus 1:4). Thus, the goal of pursuing a Paul is to develop a relationship with another Christian who can mentor you in some capacity. A Paul can accomplish this by sharing his or her wisdom with you, by equipping you with skills that you previously lacked, or by providing the proper example of a Christian life for you to emulate. Rather you are a new Christian or a mature Christian there will always be something to gain from pursuing a Paul. Remember the apostle's words in 1 Corinthians 11:1, "Follow my example, as I follow the example of Christ."
